We've added a new barge, "Exol Pride," to the North East Waterways, which will transport raw materials from Hull to our bulk blending plant in Rotherham.

Exol Lubricants has outlined more investment at its West Midlands head office and production facility.

With the objective of increased site efficiency, we will continue to provide an exceptional working environment that is capable of delivering the highest quality products and service to customers in the UK and abroad.

New for 2016 are two more Strong Arm filling machines, which are capable of filling 20, 25, 60, 205, and 1000 litre pack sizes. This investment will

increase capacity and flexibility in regards to production, making the entire process more efficient.

More telemetric gauges will be fitted to existing storage tanks and improvements made to the tank bunds and yard drainage system, emphasising our continued commitment to the environment.

Exol's capital investment plans for this year reflect that its customers and staff are its main priorities. The onsite developments will greatly enhance the service provided to customers, making it a lot more efficient.



Packing a 'small' punch

An additional 8-head Masterfil filling machine has been added to our West Midlands facility, enhancing the efficiency and production capacity of small pack products.

The Adelphi Masterfil machine is specially designed to offer flexibility of filling volumes, handling both low and high viscosity liquids.

The machine's adjustable nozzles enable the fill of products with variable speed filling capacity.

Exol has been undertaking throughout all areas of the business.

As an independently owned oil blender, it's essential that we react quickly to customer demand. This investment cements Exol's position as a complete lubricants supplier, providing all oil requirements, from bulk production to small pack quantities.

New fleet system improves deliveries



We've introduced a brand new delivery management system, Scania's Fleet Management Services including informative telematics, which will allow us to increase the productivity of our fleet and improve fuel economy.

The new system will enable Exol to take control of its fleet as the installed hardware provides the fleet's complete data, allowing the company to improve driver performance by acting on any issues such as coasting, heavy braking or idling. This has been known to save up to 10 percent in fuel economy.

It also provides Exol with easy access to the information through its personalised FMS portal available in a free smart phone app.

The app also allows Exol to send instant messages across its workforce including texts, photos, positions and historical communications through the Scania Messaging Service, keeping its workforce updated and informed at all times.

Exol's fleet of more than 20 vehicles – supplied for 22 years by vehicle partner Keltruck – comprises a mix of dual-purpose vehicles and large tanker trucks to transport both bulk and packaged Exol products to customers across a variety of sectors including agricultural, automotive, industrial, marine and rail.

The new technology will also educate the drivers on Scania's adaptive cruise control (ACC), which warns them if the distance between the vehicle ahead closes suddenly, as well as helping to maintain a constant time gap.

Scania's ACC system also analyses road speed, data from the engine, and brakes to help avoid any distractions that may occur and increase driver safety.
